

GENERAL INFORMATION

INTRODUCTION

READ THIS MANUAL carefully to learn how to operate and service your cutter correctly. Failure to do so could result in personal injury or equipment damage.

Throughout this manual, references are made to right and left direction. RIGHT - HAND AND LEFT - HAND sides are determined by standing behind the cutter facing the direction the cutter will travel when going forward.

The purpose of this manual is to assist you in operating and maintaining your cutter. Read it carefully. It furnishes information and instructions that will help you achieve years of dependable performance. These instructions have been compiled from extensive field experience and engineering data. Some information may be general in nature due to unknown and varying operating conditions.

However, through experience and these instructions, you should be able to develop procedures suitable to your particular situation.

Maintain your cutter with original repair parts to insure optimum performance.

A WARNING

Some illustrations in this manual show the cutter with shields removed to provide a better view. The cutter should never be operated without guards or shields.

The illustrations and data used in this manual were current at the time of printing, but due to possible production changes, your cutter may vary slightly in detail. We reserve the right to redesign and change the cutters as may be necessary without notification.

Your personal safety is a primary concern in the design and manufacture of our products. Unfortunately, our efforts to provide safe equipment can be wiped out by a single careless act of an operator.

In addition to the design and configuration of equipment, hazard control and accident prevention are dependent upon the awareness, concern, prudence and proper training of personnel involved in the operation, transport, maintenance and storage of equipment.

It has been said "The best safety device is an informed, careful operator." We ask you to be that kind of an operator.

The design of this equipment depends on it being operated within the limitations as explained in this manual.

TRAINING

- · Safety Instructions are Important! Read this manual and the tractor manual; follow all safety rules and safety decal information. (Replacement manuals are available from your dealer.) Failure to follow instructions or safety rules can result in serious injury or death.
- . If you do not understand any part of this manual and need assistance, see your dealer.
- Know your controls and how to stop engine and cutter quickly in an emergency.
- The operator must be instructed in and be capable of the proper operation of the equipment, its attachments and all controls. Do not allow anyone to operate this equipment without proper instructions.
- · Do not allow children or untrained persons to operate equipment.

PREPARATION

· Always wear close fitting clothing and personal protection equipment called for by the job conditions. These items may include a hard hat, safety glasses, goggles or face shield, hearing protection and safety boots. DO NOT wear loose clothing, Jewelry or any other items that may be entangled in moving parts. Tie up long hair.

- Ensure cutter is properly mounted, adjusted and in good operating condition.
- Tighten all bolts and nuts, and check that all cotter pins are Installed securely to ensure equipment Is properly assembled before operating.
- Make sure spring-activated locking pin or collar. sildes freely on driveline and is seated firmly in tractor PTO spline groove.
- Tractor must be equipped with ROPS FRAME or ROPS CAB and seat belt. Keep seat belt securely fastened. Falling off tractor can result in death from being run over or crushed. Keep foldable ROPS systems in "locked up" position at all times.
- · Remove accumulated debris from this cutter, tractor and engine to avoid fire hazard.
- Ensure all safety decals are installed. Replace if damaged. (See Safety Decals section for location.)
- Inspect chain/deflector shielding before each use. Replace If damaged.
- Ensure shields and guards are properly installed and in good condition. Replace if damaged.
- A minimum 20% of the combined tractor and cutter weight must be on tractor front wheels with cutter in transport position. Without this weight, tractor could tip over causing personal injury or death. See your tractor operators manual for information regarding adding weights.
- Inspect and clear area of stones, branches or other hard objects that might be thrown, causing injury or damage.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY

- . Keep bystanders away from cutter while it is in operation.
- Never direct discharge toward anyone.
- · Operate only in daylight or good artificial light.
- Always comply with all state and local lighting and marking requirements.

- Do not allow other people in the area when operating, attaching, removing, assembling, or servicing cutter.
- Make certain all movement of cutter components has stopped before opening blade access cover.
- · No riders are allowed on equipment.
- Always sit in tractor seat with seat belt fastened when operating controls or starting engine. Place transmission in park or neutral, engage brake and ensure all other controls are disengaged before starting tractor engine.
- Operate tractor PTO at 540 rpm. Do not exceed.
- Do not operate tractor PTO during transport.
- Look down and to the rear and make sure area is clear before operating in reverse.
- · Do not operate on steep slopes.
- Do not stop, start, or change directions suddenly on slopes.
- Use extreme care and reduce ground speed on slopes and rough terrain.
- Watch for hidden hazards on the terrain during operation.
- Stop tractor and implement immediately upon striking an obstruction. Turn off engine, remove key, inspect and repair any damage before resuming operation.
- When performing any service or maintenance, disengage power to cutter. Lower all raised components to the ground. Operate valve levers to release any hydraulic pressure. Stop engine, set parking brake and remove key before dismounting tractor.
- Keep all persons away from operator control area while performing adjustments, service or maintenance.

MAINTENANCE SAFETY

- Before performing any service or maintenance, disconnect driveline from tractor.
- Before working undermeath, raise cutter to highest position, install transport locks, and block

securely. Blocking up prevents cutter dropping from hydraulic leak down, hydraulic system failures, or mechanical failure on the tractor.

- Keep all persons away from operator control area while performing adjustments, service or maintenance.
- Frequently check blades. They should be sharp, free of nicks and cracks and securely fastened.
- Do not handle blades with bare hands. Careless or improper handling may result in serious injury.
- Your dealer can supply genuine replacement cutter blades. Substitute blades may not meet original equipment specifications.

TRANSPORTING SAFETY

- Use a Slow Moving Vehicle (SMV) emblem and proper lighting on the tractor when transporting the cutter.
- Do not road the cutter over 20 MPH (30KPH) on the best surface conditions. Reduce speed when going up or down hills and when approaching ditches or corners.
- · Raise cutter to highest position for transport.
- Check condition of hitch plns and boits before transporting.
- . Do not operate tractor PTO during transport.
- Always comply with all state and local lighting and marking requirements.
- Watch low hanging Overhead Power Lines during transport. Avoid contact as this can cause serious injury or death.

STORAGE

- Lower equipment to the ground and block to prevent rolling.
- Keep playing children and bystanders away from storage area.
- Store on a level surface sheltered from the weather.



INTRODUCTION

This manual covers the assembly, operation, and maintenance of your Series 486 Rotary Cutter. Studying and obeying these instructions will insure optimum product performance and longevity. Be sure to read all instructions carefully. Read all safety precautions prior to operation.

Maintain your rotary cutter with original repair parts to insure optimum performance.

MODIFICATIONS

It is the policy of the manufacturer to improve its products whenever possible and practical. We reserve the right to make changes, improvements, and modifications at any time without incurring the obligation to make such changes, improvements, and modifications on any implement sold previously.

ASSEMBLY

General

Your Series 486 Rolary Cutter is shipped with the three point hitch components knocked down and the deflector shields in a separate bundle. Remove all wiring from bundles as they are called for. Choose a level area to arrange the parts conveniently. Assemble parts for each step loosely to insure fit. Use flatwashers with slotted holes. Always use lockwashers unless a lock nut is called for. Tighten hardware after parts are Installed according to the torque chart given. Unless otherwise stated, all hardware is grade 5. The following assembly steps are given to minimize the need for adjustment after assembly. Remember that LEFT and RIGHT are determined by standing at the rear of the culter and facing it.

A WARNING

it is strongly recommended that the installation of deflector shields or chain shielding be installed. A rotary cutter without deflector shields can discharge large objects at high speeds which could seriously injure bystanders or the operator,

Deflector Shields or Chain Shielding

Shields are shipped fully assembled and need only be mounted to cutter deck.

- 1) Arrange shields on ground to be sure of placement on your cutter.
- 2) Attach deflector shields to cutter using hardware supplied in the shield bundle.

Check and tighten nuts after all hardware in installed.




FIGURE 3 -- 6 FOOT DECK COMPONENTS

6 Foot -- A-Frame & Braces (Refer to Fig. 3)

On some cutters, the A-frame is shipped already bolted to the deck while on others it is wired to the stump jumper. If the A-frame is already bolted to the deck, proceed to step 2,

- 1) Secure A-frame straps to deck using Cat I link pins provided (Install plns to inside). Be sure A-frame legs are on the outside of the deck braces. Stand A-frame in vertical position and tighten hardware so A-frame stands freely.
- Attach braces to outside of deck rails with 3/4" x 4" bolts. Secure with lockwasher and hex nut.
- 3) Position swinging link assembly between A-frame straps and slide bushing through both. Position braces on outside of A-frame straps and insert 3/4" x 6" bolt through 3/4" flat washer, pull brace, A-frame, spacer bushing, A-frame, pull brace, 3/4" flat washer, and 3/4" lock washer. Secure with hex nut. Be sure swinging link assembly floats freely.
- 4) Check and tighten all hardware.

Installing Drive Line Sllp Clutch Models:



WARNING

Keep drive line shields in place at all times and in good repair. Replace broken shields.

- 1) Depress push button on yoke of driveline while sliding it onto the splined input shaft of the gearbox.
- With the driveline fed onto the input shaft, release the push button. Slide the drive line further onto the shaft until the push button releases, locking the driveline onto the shaft.
- 3) Push and pull the driveline to insure it is locked in place.
- 4) Attach shield retaining chain included with drive line to shield and A-frame. The chain keeps the driveline shield from rotating when the PTO is engaged. Make sure the chain is installed properly at all times to prevent rotation of shield.

BEFORE OPERATION

- Tighten all loose hardware using the torque chart. SEE ASSEMBLY. Replace any missing hardware. On new machines, all hardware must be rechecked after first few hours of operation.
- 2) Replace any bent or broken parts.
- 3) Perform lubrication on implement as recommended. **SEE MAINTENANCE.**
- 4) Refer to your Tractor's Owner's Manual for recommended adjustments and weight distribution.
- 5) Check the cutter's gearbox oil level by removing pipe plug on rear of housing. Add oil using SAE 90EP gear oil as required. DO NOT overfill.
- 6) Check gearbox mount bolts to see that they are tight.
- 7) Check all shields and make sure they are in place.
- 8) Check blades for signs of wear or damage. Sharpen dull blades and replace bent or broken blades. **SEE BLADE REPLACEMENT**.
- 9) Read the SAFETY section of this manual to be sure of all precautions.

ATTACHING

1) Back tractor to align three point hitch.


Be sure bystanders are clear. Do not stand between implement and tractor. Shut off tractor and engage parking brake prior to dismounting.

- Attach tractor lower link arms to cutter. Secure with click pins.
- 3) Attach top link between tractor and cutter. Secure with click pins.
- 4) Attach drive line to tractor by pushing in on push button and sliding the yoke onto the tractor's PTO shaft. Make sure the push button releases and locks the drive line in place.
- 5) Attach shield retaining chain included with driveline to shield and A-frame. The chain keeps the driveline shield from rotating when the PTO is engaged. Make sure the chain is installed properly at all times to prevent rotation of shield.

This cutter is designed for brush up to 2" (50.8mm) diameter. DO NOT use in brush larger than 2" (50.8mm) diameter.

A WARNING

A minimum 20% of the combined tractor and cutter weight must be on tractor front wheels with attachment in transport position. Without this weight, tractor could tip over causing personal injury or death. See your tractor operators manual



for information regarding adding weights.

OPERATION

- 1) With tractor at a slow idle, engage the PTO slowly and let the cutter run for several seconds.
- 2) Gradually increase throttle speed until operating speed is obtained. Listen for unusual noises or vibration. Shut the tractor off immediately if excessive noise or vibration occurs. Allow all moving parts to come to a complete stop and investigate cause.
- 3) A new gearbox will sound noisy in the first few hours of operation until the gears mesh.
- Get to know the feel of your new cutter on familiar ground that is free of obstacles.

ADJUSTMENTS

WARNING

Do not make any adjustments while cutter is in motion or when PTO is engaged.

Side to Side Leveling:

 Your cutter should be level from side to side. With the cutter and tractor on level ground, use the tractor's link arm crank to adjust the lower link arm up or down as needed to level cutter.

Front to Rear Leveling:

- 1) Adjust rear tailwheel to desired cutting height. Using the tractor's three point lift, position the front of cutter 1" lower than rear. At this slight angle, the cutter does not require as much power. Fuel efficiency and cutter performance are thereby improved.
- Adjust the top link in or out so the brace bolt in centered in A-frame slot.
- Check the tailwheel to see that it contacts the ground.
 If it does not, reposition the rear tailwheel arm boit to lower the tailwheel as needed to contact the ground.
- 4) If the tailwheel is too low causing too much front to rear tilt, adjust the tailwheel up by moving the rear bolt to the next hole. Readjust the top link to properly position deck with slight tilt forward.

Drive Line Interference:

- Start the tractor engine and slowly lift cutter until the drive line is at its shortest position. At this point, the two telescoping shafts should lack two inches (50.8mm) from touching.
- Now lower the cutter until the drive line is extended to its longest position. At this point, the two shafts should engage at least six inches (152mm).
- 3) Be sure the drive line clears the cutter deck when the cutter is raised. If it does not, readjust the top link on the hitch to correct the problem or set lift quadrant stop on tractor lever. The tailwheel may then have to be adjusted so the cutter can be properly positioned for operation.

TRANSPORTING

- Disengage PTO and allow all moving parts to completely stop.
- 2) Raise cutter to fully raised position.
- 3) Transport at no more than 20 MPH (30KPH).
- 4) Use care when transporting on rough terrain.
- 5) When traveling on public roads, always have a slow moving vehicle (SMV) emblem mounted to the tractor such that it is visible from the rear.
- Avoid travel on public roads at night. Check local laws governing lighting requirements in addition to SMV emblem.

A WARNING

Do not perform any maintenance while tractor is running or when cutter is in motion.

Gearbox:

- 1) Check oil level in gearbox about every 40 hours of use by removing pipe plug on rear of housing. Fill to side port using only SAE 90EP gear oil.
- 2) Check mount bolts before each use to be sure they are tight.

Blade Inspection and Replacement:

Inspect blades before each use. Sharpen worn blades and replace in pairs if blades are damaged. To replace blades, follow the steps below:


- 1) Support cutter from below on all sides. DO NOT rely on tractor's hydraulic lift alone to support cutter. Be sure cutter is stable before proceeding.
- 2) Remove each blade nut and lockwasher through the hole in the cutter deck behind gearbox.
- 3) Using a punch, drive the blade bolts out of the blade holder.
- 4) Insert blade bolts in new blades so that flare in blade tip is up. Insert bolt with blade onto blade holder by aligning notch in hole with shoulder on bolt.
- 5) Replace lockwashers and nuts on bolts and tighten. Torque to 650 ft-lbs (881 N.m).

Slip Clutch

Operational Check:

On a new unit or one that has been stored between seasons, perform the following check:

- 1) Loosen all spring retaining nuts until springs can be turned with fingers.
- 2) With tractor at idle speed, engage PTO for 2--3 seconds, Clutch should slip without turning blades. If not, contact your dealer.
- 3) Retighten nuts to compress springs according to diagram. Dim "A" = 1.28" (32.5mm) for Corner clutches.



IMPORTANT

Failure to retighten nuts can cause damage to implement and/or tractor due to improper slip clutch torque setting.

Adjustment:

The slip clutch is designed to slip when blades encounter heavy brush or solid permanent objects. If this is not occurring or if the clutch slips too much (i.e. the clutch begins to smoke), adjustment should be made as follows.

- 1) Check to be sure that all springs are compressed to the correct length. Adjust spring length by tightening or loosening retaining nut.
- 2) If clutch still performs improperly, tighten or loosen all nuts in 1/32" (0.81mm) increments until clutch performs properly.
- If excessive adjustment is necessary, consult your dealer.

LUBRICATION SCHEDULE

Clean grease fittings before applying grease. Use multipurpose lithium base grease.

Before Each Use

Tailwheel -- Apply grease at arm fitting and hub fitting.

Driveline -- Lubricate universal joints at fittings and shield at fittings.

Every 8 Hours

Driveline -- Lubricate universal joints at fittings and shield at fittings.

Every 16 Hours


Driveline -- Lubricate push buttons with oil.

Disconnect driveline and separate sections. Apply a thin coat of grease to outside of male shaft. Reassemble driveline and install. Be sure drive line is locked in place and shield retaining chain is properly attached.

Gearboxes -- Use SAE EP90 Gear oil if needed.

STORAGE

- 1) Clean all debris from cutter deck and drive line.
- 2) Store cutter on a level surface sheltered from the weather.
- 3) Lower cutter to ground for storage and block to prevent rolling.
- 4) Store cutter supported on blocks to allow air circulation beneath cutter.
- 5) Support tractor end of driveline to keep off the ground.
- Keep playing children and bystanders away from storage area.
